The Lollipop Moment

Recently, the LWML Indiana District held their Treatshop at Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Tipton. It was a wonderful event, where women from all generations - the youngest still in their mother's arms, to the most seasoned veterans - gathered in fellowship. We were truly "Connecting through Christ Jesus" - the focus and theme of our event. Our committee was so pleased to speak with the many women who attended our session called "Can You Hear Me Now?" During our time together we encouraged one another to consider the similarities and differences between our generations, so that we might see one another through a new lens as we reach out to each other - perhaps, with a purple spiral lollipop in hand.

You may be asking yourself, "what's a 'Lollipop Moment'?" This comes from a TEDx Talk we

watched (<u>TEDxToronto-Drew Dudley "Leading with Lollipops</u>"), in which the speaker encouraged a young man on a college campus to reach out and connect with the new student standing near him by giving her a lollipop. Now, I'm not suggesting you run out and buy a bag of lollipops, but instead remember that it is the principle of making that first step to talk to another man, woman, or family in your congregation, workplace, or community which can make all the difference for them or for you.



In Matthew 11:28-29, Christ teaches us to come to Him with all our burdens, all of us who are heavy laden. We are to take His yoke upon ourselves and learn from Him, knowing that He is gentle and lowly in heart, giving our souls true rest. Does Your LWML Welcome Young Women?

The LWML IN District Zone Presidents met for an Assembly of Zone Presidents before the March BOD meeting. Many leadership presentations and activities were presented. An interactive survey was posted with zone presidents responding "yes" or "no" to each question.

- 1. When an LWML event is held, I personally invite women who seldom or never participate in LWML events or activities. 12 responded yes. 6 responded no.
- 2. I make an effort to welcome newcomers to our congregation. 15 responded yes, 3 responded no.
- 3. I understand the vast time demands on today's women and am supportive when they are unable to attend every event. 17 responded yes. 0 responded no.
- 4. I am flexible with times and dates of events. 13 responded yes. 3 responded no.
- 5. Our group provides opportunities for relationship-building among the younger and older members. 3 responded yes. 15 responded no.
- 6. Our group offers meaningful experiences which will help women grow in their faith. 12 responded yes. 5 responded no.
- 7. Our group encourages women to serve the Lord by participating in service projects and mission events. 18 responded yes. 0 responded no.
- 8. Our group educates the women in our congregation about LWML by:
 - a. Hosting special activities on LWML Sunday.
 - b. Promoting LWML events in the newsletter, website, and on various social media channels.
 - c. Sharing the Lutheran Woman's Quarterly (or eQuarterly) with all the women in our congregation.
 - d. Publicizing mites and mission grant recipient stories. 17 responded yes. 0 responded no.
- 9. I take a personal interest in the women in our congregation and seek to discover their gifts and talents. 9 responded yes. 6 responded no.
- 10. I am willing to think out-of-the-box and try to do things in a new and creative manner. 17 responded yes. 1 responded no.

How would **you** respond to the same questions about your congregation? Use this information to help you reach out to more women in your church. You'll be glad you did.


