I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus (Philippians 1:3-6).

Dear Fellow Redeemed.

These treasured words from the Apostle Paul, inspired by the Holy Spirit, are on my heart and mind as I write this article. This section from Philippians has long been a favorite of mine. The events of the last month have only brought it to be more and more treasured than ever. Just to make sure everyone is informed of these events, allow me to briefly update you. On May 7, I suffered a heart attack at the very end of our 10:30 service. My wife, Julie, was able to get me to the hospital where a stent was placed in my Left Anterior Descending artery (the main artery for the heart, it happened to be 100% blocked). Two days later, I was discharged from the hospital. I spent two weeks of rest and then one week of working part time. Right before Memorial Day weekend, the cardiologist released me to get back to regular schedule as long as I listen to my body for signs and symptoms of something wrong, participate in the cardiac rehab (which started June 1), and make the dietary and lifestyle changes necessary. God be praised!

Thank you for your love and grace shown to this under-shepherd and his wife and family. It has been truly humbling to receive many get well cards from so many of you including those from across the greater LWML world. Thank you! As the Apostle Paul says above, I thank God every time for you, always praying with joy.

There are two brief Bible passages to share in closing that were both on my heart and mind as I was in the ER that Sunday afternoon being wheeled into the heart cath lab. First is the conclusion of Psalm 23 – "goodness and mercy shall follow" me all the days of my life and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever." "Follow" is too weak of a translation. It should really be "pursue." God's goodness and mercy for me, a sinner, were pursuing me through that heart attack and placement of a stent.

The second was back from Philippians in chapter three. "What is more, I consider everything a loss compared to the surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them rubbish, that I may gain Christ and be found in Him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ – the righteousness that

comes from God and is by faith." (Philippians 3:8-9 – the highlighted portion was especially on my heart and mind as I didn't know how the pain of a heart attack would end.)

These passages are still resonating within me and, I pray, are exemplified in my manner of living and ministry. Thank you. Praise God. And let's rejoice as we work together in His Kingdom!
