Oh that you would rend the heavens and come down, that the mountains might quake at your presence (Isaiah 64:1).

Dear Fellow Redeemed,

Ready or not, here comes Advent! This year Advent is the *shortest* it can be: 21 ½ days. The morning of December 24 – being a Sunday this year – is still considered Advent. This year it's the Fourth Sunday in Advent. This year I'll admit I'm not sure if I'm ready. My definition of "ready" usually has something to do with my mood – am I in the mood for Advent? The skeptic might point to the early snows we've had and conclude a snow-loving preacher is ready for Advent when there's snow on the ground. However, I'm simply admitting a truth which I cannot explain. I'm just not ready.

Ready or not, here comes Advent! Regardless of my fickle mood...the truth remains. Advent is coming! And, truth be told, *praise God Advent is coming!* Advent celebrates the three different times in human history that Jesus Christ has (or will... or does) come into our lives. We certainly focus upon the coming celebration of His birth in Bethlehem. Through the short four Sundays of Advent (three weeks and part of one day, but I digress!) we will transition from the prophetic message of the Messiah to the particular, fascinating details of His birth. The glow from the manger will be growing as we work our way through Advent. We will see the joy on the students' faces as they share the joy of Jesus' birth in the Christmas Services. Advent also helps us long for the day of Christ's return. Dr. Luke, the Gospel writer, records Jesus' encouragement about recognizing the signs that His return is drawing near, *Now when these things begin to take place, straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near* (Luke 21:28). Yes, indeed, come, Lord Jesus!

However, the coming – the Advent – of Jesus that most speaks to my heart right now is His immediate coming through the means of Word and Sacrament. Right now, in these days, in the midst of our current struggles, comes Jesus Christ. Fulfilling the prophecy of Isaiah Jesus Christ doesn't wait for an invitation into our lives. He breaks through to give peace in these days of struggles and strife. In the midst of "class warfare" He comes as the Prince of Peace, the one who unites us all in His love and grace. He comes in the midst of my guilt and shame to bring the soothing balm of forgiveness and mercy. He isn't even waiting for me to get my act together (or to tune my fickle feelings to the marvelous harmony of His

Advent). He comes! And the arrival of the King of kings and Lord of lords in our lives always causes a joyful celebration.

Incorporating Prayer in Our Lives

Prayer is vital in our spiritual life. It is a conversation with God. We can talk to God anytime, but if you are at a loss as to where to begin, try looking in our Catechism and other Lutheran prayer sources such as our hymnal.

Below is a prayer plan that was shared by Pastor Kearney and Pastor Wolfmueller. It consists of Luther's morning and evening prayers, our statement of faith and the 10 Commandments. Prayers and declarations of faith remind us of the Lord's presence and keep us strong. Prayer is a gift of God for us to use to praise Him and communicate with Him.

Prayer Plan:

Begin with the sign of the cross.

Recite Luther's Morning Prayer:

I thank You, my heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have kept me this night from all harm and danger; and I pray that You would keep me this day also from sin and every evil, that all my doings and life may please You. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen.

Recite the Apostles' Creed:

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

Recite the 10 Commandments:

- 1. You shall have no other gods.
- 2. You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God.
- 3. Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.
- 4. Honor your father and your mother.
- 5. You shall not murder.
- 6. You shall not commit adultery.
- 7. You shall not steal.
- 8. You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.
- 9. You shall not covet your neighbor's house.
- 10. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.

Recite the Lord's Prayer:

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

WHERE'S THE MONEY?

Remember the Wendy's ad that boldly asked, "WHERE'S THE BEEF?" Let's switch the subject to money. We have many multicultural ministries in the Indiana District, such as Hispanic outreach in Indianapolis and Northeast Indiana, South Sudanese ministry in Louisville, Kentucky, Chinese missions in the Evansville area, Burmese ministry and African Immigrant ministry in Fort Wayne, Tamil (India) mission efforts in Indianapolis, Japanese outreach



in central Indiana, and more. Our Christian sisters who help in these often see great opportunities to share Jesus with others of their own diverse cultures, but they are stymied because the opportunities require money to make them happen. Usually, they are working with the pastors of their churches or specially designated church workers. The opportunities are put on their hearts, but the funds are lacking.

Here is where you come in. The Indiana District offers the chance to apply for grants to fund

But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus (Philippians 4:19 KJV). projects. The pastors and Christian sisters in the middle of multicultural efforts often do not know about this. One of our Mission grants may be exactly how God plans to provide for their mission effort. Even if they know about the grants, they may not feel adequate to apply for one. Perhaps English is

not their native language. Perhaps they are so busy in the ministry that they cannot find the time to apply.

Please ask God to open your eyes to notice the ethnic pastors and multi-cultural sisters who may be around you and encourage them in their work by telling them about the mission grant possibilities. **Perhaps you can even volunteer to help them write a grant proposal!** There are two kinds of grant proposals: \$5000 and under and \$5001 to \$12,000. So far, since the \$5000 grants have been offered, each \$5000 proposal has received funding. Proposals for the larger amount are mainly funded, but some each year do not get funded. Starting with the smaller grant would be recommended. The deadline for submitting grant proposals is January 15, 2024. The grant proposals will be voted on at our 2024 Indiana District convention in June.
